On behalf of the Utah Mammoth's Media Relations Department, we hope to make your job covering the team as easy and as pleasant as possible. In order to help our operation run smoothly and make your jobs easier, we ask that you please review and adhere to the following guidelines:

DAILY PRACTICES

Practices will be held at the Utah Mammoth practice and training facility unless stated otherwise. All practices are open to the media. For up-to-date information on practice times and locations, please contact Jeffrey Sanders (jeffrey.sanders@utahmammoth.com) to be included on the team's practice reminder email distribution list. A member of the PR staff will escort the media into the locker room following practice for player/coach availability.

PREGAME ACCESS

Requests for interviews prior to the game will be accommodated only upon the approval of the players and coach involved. Ahead of a 7 P.M. puck drop, Utah players can be made available from 4:30 P.M. to 5 P.M. However, the ideal time for interviews on game day is after morning skate, which is traditionally held at 10:30 A.M. (practice times and location are subject to change). Please contact Jeffrey Sanders with all player requests.

POSTGAME ACCESS

Both teams' dressing rooms will be open approximately five minutes after each game. Media attending locker room availabilities should use stairwell 4 across from section 9 on the main concourse to access the locker room hallway, where they will be held until PR representatives have opened the dressing rooms. Media will have access to the players for 30 minutes after the rooms are opened. Only working media with official credentials will be allowed into the dressing rooms. Following the player media access, Head Coach André Tourigny will be available for postgame comments in the interview room.

The Utah Mammoth media relations department is happy to help make special accommodations for any media who are unable to use the stairs for postgame access. Please reach out to David Piper (david.piper@utahmammoth.com) or Rachel Boorse (rachel.boorse@utahmammoth.com) in advance to plan an alternative route.

PRESS BOX ACCESS

Seating has been assigned to media in the lower bowl at Delta Center in section 9. Seating charts displaying seating assignments will be posted at media check-in.

BROADCAST BOOTH POSITIONS

The home TV booth can be found in section 18, and visiting TV will have space on the inside of the press row at the top of section 16. Both teams' radio broadcast positions are located in section 7. In the event that a third TV broadcast position is required, one will be added on the inside of the press row at the top of section 20.

GAME NOTES & STATS

Printed game notes and league stats will be made available for broadcasters. Additional materials (intermission stats, in-game notes, etc.) will be distributed to all working media throughout the game.

MEDIA POLICY

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to working media only. The media entrance at Delta Center is on the south side of the building (100 South), to the left of public entrance Door 9. No media access will be allowed through public doors, and all credentials are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use will subject the bearer to removal from Delta Center and confiscation of their credential. All media are required to display their credentials at all times. Please contact David Piper (david.piper@utahmammoth.com) and Rachel Boorse (rachel.boorse@utahmammoth.com) with single-game credential requests.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Still photography credentials will be issued in the same manner as media credentials. Newspapers, websites, and magazines on assignment may obtain passes by having their photo editor request single-game credentials from David Piper (david.piper@utahmammoth.com). Photo positions will be assigned by the Mammoth's team photographer, Hunter Dyke (hunter.dyke@teamseg.com), on a game-by-game basis and in accordance with league protocols and hierarchies. All photographers must comply with space assignments and shooting regulations and shoot from designated areas only. Should photographers have any questions or require any additional information regarding equipment (i.e. strobes), they are asked to please contact Hunter Dyke.

VIDEO FOOTAGE

Media are not permitted under any circumstances to publicize video footage of any game action, from the start of warmups to the final horn. This includes gameplay as well as fights, celebrations, and any other on-ice action between whistles. League policies mandate that broadcast rightsholders are granted exclusivity during this time, and violation of this rule could result in credential revocation.

INTERVIEW VIDEOS

The Utah Mammoth media relations department will provide video and/or audio recordings of interviews with coaches and players following practices, morning skates, and games. To receive the link to those videos, please contact David Piper (david.piper@utahmammoth.com).

MEDIA PARKING

The Utah Mammoth does not provide parking for the media. It is recommended that you walk to Delta Center, use TRAX or park in one of the paid lots near the arena.

MEDIA WORKROOM

Throughout the game, still photographers may find workspace available in room 107 on ice level. For print media, the primary media workroom will be located in Skyboxes 6312-6314 on the sixth floor. Once postgame availabilities have concluded, print media working on deadline will be permitted to use the ice-level workroom to finalize their stories. Both spaces can be accessed via the main concourse elevator across from section T. The Utah Mammoth rely on media members to maintain a courteous and professional atmosphere in the press rooms at all times. Children and non-working media are not allowed in the press rooms.

Media.NHL.com is a comprehensive resource for all media members covering the Utah Mammoth and the NHL. From media contacts to player statistics to league news, the site provides countless useful resources for media. You can quickly request an account from the main login page, and we highly recommend that you create one. You will then begin to receive NHL and Mammoth-specific announcements straight to your email inbox.

RYAN SMITH

CHAIRMAN & CEO, SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP
GOVERNOR, UTAH JAZZ AND UTAH MAMMOTH
FOUNDER AND EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN, QUALTRICS
CO-FOUNDER, HALO EXPERIENCE COMPANY

Ryan Smith is the chairman and CEO of Smith Entertainment Group and the governor of both the NBA's Utah Jazz and the NHL's Utah Mammoth. He is also the founder and executive chairman of Qualtrics, the creator of the experience management (XM) category, and a co-founder of Halo Experience Company (HXCO).

Ryan and his wife, Ashley, purchased the Utah Jazz in late 2020 as part of the launch of Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), and in April 2024, brought the NHL to Utah with the purchase of a new franchise that was known as Utah Hockey Club during its inaugural season (2024-25) before being permanently branded as the Utah Mammoth in spring 2025. SEG's current portfolio also encompasses Delta Center, SEG Media, The Shops at South Town, Salt Lake City Stars (NBA G League), and other Utah-centric business ventures.

Ryan grew Qualtrics from a basement startup to one of the fastest-growing technology companies in the world, with 25 offices globally and more than 16,700 customers, including over 85 percent of the Fortune 100, and 99 of the top 100 business schools. In the private market, Qualtrics raised \$400M in funding from Accel, Sequoia, and Insight Venture Partners. Three days before the company was initially scheduled to go public, SAP announced its intent to acquire Qualtrics in what was the largest private enterprise software acquisition at that time. In 2021, Qualtrics listed for an initial public offering on the Nasdaq under the ticker symbol "XM." The company was then taken private in July 2023 in a private equity buyout led by Silverlake.

In 2016, Ryan co-founded 5 For The Fight, the campaign to eradicate cancer by supporting groundbreaking cancer research. The campaign invites everyone to give \$5 for the fight against cancer. The 5 For The Fight patch, donated by Qualtrics, was worn on the Utah Jazz jerseys from 2017 to 2023 and was the first philanthropic patch in the history of North American professional sports. In September 2023, Ryan announced that 5 For The Fight had achieved its goal of raising \$50 million for cancer research.

Most recently in April 2025, Ryan launched a new joint venture with long-time business partner Ryan Sweeney – Halo Experience Company (HXCO), a Utah-based investment firm that connects high-growth technology companies with strategic opportunities across sports and entertainment.



ASHLEY SMITH

OWNER, UTAH JAZZ & UTAH MAMMOTH
CO-FOUNDER, SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP

Ashley Smith is a powerful entrepreneur and leader with a giant heart. She and her husband, Ryan Smith, became owners of the Utah Jazz in December 2020, driven by their shared love of basketball and passion for being stewards of Utah. In April 2024, they acquired Utah's first-ever NHL franchise, which competed under the name Utah Hockey Club during their inaugural season and was officially named Utah Mammoth in spring 2025.

An accomplished dancer and longtime patron of the arts, Ashley is also the founder and CEO of Smash Dance Academy - one of the largest dance studios in Utah - which she opened in 2006 with a goal of providing opportunities for youth to express themselves through the art of dance.

Ashley plays an active role in guiding how Smith Entertainment Group and its entities utilize their platforms to impact the local community through the SEG Foundation and other initiatives including the Utah Jazz Scholars Program, 5 For The Fight, and Utah's Show-Up Initiative. For her work with Encircle, she received the organization's LGBTQ+ Ally Award in 2024.



CHRIS ARMSTRONG

PRESIDENT OF HOCKEY OPERATIONS
AND ALTERNATE GOVERNOR, UTAH MAMMOTH

Chris Armstrong was named the first-ever president of hockey operations for Utah's NHL team in June 2024 and also serves as an alternate governor for the club. In his role, Armstrong leads the Utah Mammoth and collaborates closely with ownership to serve both business and hockey operations as well as sitting on the executive leadership team at SEG in helping to build a world-class organization.

Prior to his role with Utah, Armstrong spent nearly 14 years at Wasserman, a global sports marketing and talent management company, as the Executive Vice President for Talent, Innovation, and Strategic Development. At Wasserman, Armstrong was instrumental in founding the firm's Canadian business in 2010 and played a key role in the acquisition strategy that established the company's hockey practice in 2018. He contributed significantly to growing the company's hockey business, maintaining high-level relationships with the League and its partners, and supporting marketing, content, and brand efforts for Wasserman's top NHL players. He also negotiated several contracts for prominent hockey executives over the past decade. Additionally, he was a central figure in Wasserman's global golf practice, managing the careers of numerous star players and personalities, including Utah native Tony Finau.

Born in Montreal, Armstrong attended McGill University, where he was recruited by men's hockey coach Martin Raymond (Tampa Bay Lightning, Ottawa Senators) and later became a part of the Redmen (now Redbirds) coaching staff. He continued as a part-time amateur scout for McGill in the Ontario Hockey League and worked at the Centre for Sport and Law in Canada whilst completing a degree in Sport Management from Brock University. He spent the first six years of his professional career at IMG, a leading global sports and entertainment agency.

Armstrong's leadership and contributions in the sports industry have been widely recognized throughout his career. He was named to Sports Business Journal's "Forty under 40" list in 2021 and received the Canadian sports industry "5 to Watch" award in 2013 as one of the nation's top executives under 40. In 2012, Brock University honored him with his second Distinguished Alumni Award and recognized him as one of the institution's top 35 alumni in the past 35 years. Furthermore, he was the youngest executive named to the Globe and Mail's "Sports Power 50" list in 2011.

Armstrong resides in Salt Lake City and is deeply committed to his philanthropic and community engagement efforts. He serves as chair of the Canadian board for GlobalCitizen, a global movement to eradicate extreme poverty. While at Wasserman, he also helped organize an athlete-centered goodwill mission to Israel, using sport as a tool for diplomacy and to bring prominent Israeli and Palestinian youth leaders together in a conflict-free environment. He and his wife, actor Abigail Klein, share their time between Utah and Los Angeles.



BILL ARMSTRONG

GENERAL MANAGER, UTAH MAMMOTH

Bill Armstrong, the first general manager in franchise history, enters his second season with Utah. He was named general manager of the Arizona Coyotes on September 17, 2020, and continued in his role upon Smith Entertainment Group's acquisition of the Utah NHL team in April 2024. Prior to his role with Arizona, Armstrong spent 16 years with the St. Louis Blues where he served as the team's assistant general manager and director of amateur scouting.

During his tenures with Utah and Arizona, Armstrong has added several talented players through trades and NHL Drafts including Mikhail Sergachev, Dylan Guenther, Logan Cooley, JJ Peterka, Sean Durzi, Jack McBain, Maveric Lamoureux, Dmitri Simashev, Daniil But, Michael Hrabal, Tij Iginla, Cole Beaudoin, and Caleb Desnoyers.

In St. Louis, Armstrong helped the Blues win their first Stanley Cup championship in 2019, ending the third-longest championship drought in league history. During his time there, he oversaw the team's participation in the NHL Draft, and in a seven-year span, orchestrated the selections of players including Jake Allen, Joel Edmundson, Robby Fabbri, Colton Parayko, Vince Dunn, Jordan Binnington, and Robert Thomas, all of whom played roles in the Blues capturing the 2019 Stanley Cup.

Prior to joining the Blues, Armstrong spent six seasons as a coach in the American Hockey League (AHL) and East Coast Hockey League (ECHL). He began as an assistant coach with the AHL's Providence Bruins in 1998, helping lead the club to the 1999 Calder Cup Championship. Following his time in Providence, he spent two seasons (2002-04) as the head coach of the Trenton Titans of the ECHL.

A native of Richmond Hill, Ontario, Armstrong played four seasons in the Ontario Hockey League (OHL), winning the Memorial Cup with the Oshawa Generals in 1990. Drafted in the third round (46th overall) by the Philadelphia Flyers in 1990, Armstrong played nine seasons in the AHL and the International Hockey League (IHL), appearing in 543 games and collecting 74 points (10 goals, 64 assists) and 1,443 penalty minutes.



JOHN FERGUSON

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

GENERAL MANAGER OF THE TUCSON ROADRUNNERS

John Ferguson was named Coyotes assistant general manager and general manager of the Tucson Roadrunners on Sept. 15, 2021. He moved to Utah during the franchise's relocation and remains in the same role with the Mammoth.

Ferguson joined the Coyotes from the Boston Bruins, where for seven years, he served as the organization's executive director of player personnel and general manager of the Providence Bruins (AHL). Ferguson joined the Bruins' hockey operations staff on June 27, 2014 and was named as general manager for Providence on Sept. 15, 2016. While with the Bruins, Ferguson scouted at the professional and amateur levels with an eye to adding both prospects and roster players to the team. He also served as an advisor in evaluating potential trades, signings, and other transactions.

The Montreal native brings a wealth of experience to the Coyotes' front office, having run every facet of a hockey operations department during his career. Ferguson previously served for six seasons as the director of pro scouting for the San Jose Sharks (2008-14), four-plus seasons as vice president and general manager of the Toronto Maple Leafs (2003-08), and six seasons as assistant general manager and director of hockey operations with the St. Louis Blues (1997-2003). He has also been both an amateur and professional scout for the Ottawa Senators.

In 2007, Ferguson served as a member of Team Canada's management group at the 2007 IIHF World Championship in Russia. He collaborated with Steve Yzerman in selecting Canada's unbeaten gold medal roster which was the youngest team to ever win a World Championship.

Ferguson played college hockey at Providence College where he served as an assistant captain and was an Academic All-American. He was drafted by the Montreal Canadiens as a 12th round selection in the 1985 NHL Entry Draft and played four seasons at the AHL level with Sherbrooke, Peoria, Fredericton, and New Haven. In 1995, he earned his law degree from Suffolk University Law School and was a player agent for one season in 1996-97.

He and his wife Stephanie have four children, sons Johnny and Nicholas and daughters Emily and Grace.



DAVID LUDWIG

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

David Ludwig is the assistant general manager of the Utah Mammoth. He transferred with the franchise from Arizona where he originally joined the Coyotes in December 2020 as the team's director of hockey operations & salary cap compliance. He was promoted to his current role on February 14, 2024.

In this capacity, Ludwig advises General Manager Bill Armstrong with all facets of the hockey operations department, including salary cap management, contract negotiations, strategic roster planning, player salary arbitration and compliance with all issues pertaining to the NHL/NHLPA Collective Bargaining Agreement. He also assists in the oversight of individuals in their specific duties for the club.

The Culver City, California native arrived to Arizona following 10 years at KO Sports, Inc. where he was a Certified Player Agent with the NHL Players' Association and served as the company's director of hockey operations & licensing. In those roles, Ludwig was primarily responsible and involved in all areas of player contract negotiations and salary arbitration, endorsement and licensing contracts, free agency and the NHL Entry Draft while also scouting and identifying elite hockey prospects in both Western Canada and the United States.

Ludwig, who is both a United States and Canadian citizen, attended the University of Colorado Boulder where he won an American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) National Championship in 2005 and received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communications in 2008. Ludwig later earned his Juris Doctorate from the University of Denver, Sturm College of Law in 2012 and is a member in good standing of the Colorado Bar Association.

David and his wife, Ellen, welcomed their first child, Benjamin, in February 2025 and currently reside in Salt Lake City with their dogs, Dolly and Izzy.



LARRY PLEAU

SENIOR ADVISOR TO THE GENERAL MANAGER

Larry Pleau is in his second season with the Utah Mammoth. He was originally named as senior advisor to the general manager on August 6, 2021 with the Arizona Coyotes.

Pleau is a three-time Stanley Cup Champion and was inducted into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2000 and was also honored as a recipient of the Lester Patrick Trophy for outstanding service to hockey in the United States in 2002. Pleau was assistant general manager of the 2002 U.S. Olympic team, which won the silver medal. He also served as general manager of Team USA at the 2003 and 2004 IIHF World Championships and the 2004 World Cup of Hockey.

Pleau brings extensive NHL front office experience to the Mammoth. He was named general manager of the St. Louis Blues on June 9, 1997, and helped the Blues win the NHL's President's Trophy in 1999-2000. Pleau served as GM of the Blues from 1997-2010 and worked in the team's scouting department after that. He was part of the team's front office when St. Louis won the 2019 Stanley Cup.

Pleau joined the Blues after spending eight seasons with the New York Rangers organization where he last served as vice president of player personnel and helped the Rangers capture the Stanley Cup in 1993-94.

The Lynn, MA native also spent 17 seasons with the Hartford Whalers organization in a variety of roles including player, assistant coach, head coach, general manager and minor league general manager and head coach. He was instrumental in the Whalers drafting Ray Ferraro, Ron Francis, Kevin Dineen and Ulf Samuelson.

Pleau played three NHL seasons with the Montreal Canadiens, totaling 9-15-24 in 94 games and was part of Montreal's 1971 Stanley Cup title. He became the first player signed by the Whalers of the World Hockey Association (WHA). Pleau recorded 157-215-372 in 468 career WHA games with the Whalers. The former center represented the United States at the 1968 Olympics, on the 1969 U.S. National Team and at the 1976 Canada Cup.



CHRIS BARNEY

PRESIDENT OF REVENUE AND COMMERCIAL STRATEGY
SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP

Chris Barney is the president of revenue and commercial strategy for Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), overseeing all revenue-generating and marketing functions across the organization's assets, including the Utah Jazz NBA franchise, the Utah Mammoth NHL franchise, and their home arena, Delta Center. His role also extends to the Salt Lake City Stars NBA G League team and key initiatives at the recently acquired The Shops at South Town mall, future home of the Utah Mammoth's new practice and training facility.

Since joining the Utah Jazz in September 2007, Barney has taken on a variety of responsibilities across every revenue-generating department within the organization. After eight years in sales, he moved into various ticketing and premium seating roles, eventually becoming chief revenue officer in December 2020. In April 2022, he was promoted to chief commercial officer. Today, Barney leads the partnership, premium seating, ticketing, data/analytics, marketing, brand/creative, and youth program departments while also overseeing food and beverage operations, retail, and events at Delta Center.

In 2024 under Barney's leadership, SEG introduced new programs geared toward further enhancing the fan experience at Delta Center. These include the rollout of fan friendly concessions – dubbed the 'Mountain Menu,' which reduced the cost of several fan-favorite food items for all Utah Jazz and the Utah Mammoth home games to \$2 and \$3 – as well as agreements Smith's and Moxie Pest Control to offer single goal view seats to Utah Mammoth games, complete with a hotdog and bottle of water, for just \$10.

Over the past few seasons, Barney has been instrumental in securing several high-impact Utah Jazz partnerships, including agreements with Awardco, American Express, PACS, and SeatGeek. In 2023, Barney played a key role in bringing Delta Air Lines back as the naming rights partner for the Delta Center and securing a multi-year deal with LiveView Technologies (LVT) as the team's jersey patch sponsor. He was instrumental in the June 2024 launch of the Utah Jazz marketing platform, "Mountain Basketball," which connects the team's identity to the region's rugged landscape. Leading into the 2023-24 NBA season, Barney also provided key strategic counsel that allowed the Jazz to land their over-the-air local broadcast deal and create their first-ever branded streaming service, Jazz+ – two moves that set the team apart for taking control of their distribution landscape.

In addition, his creative approach to the premium experience has helped the Jazz launch unique, compelling offerings in their arena, which have driven an increase in ticket revenue and helped the Jazz claim a spot within the NBA's top 10 teams in ticket sales. In 2021, Utah Business named Barney one of its "40 Under 40" honorees.

A graduate of the University of Utah, Barney enjoys spending time with his family, traveling, attending Utes football games and watching his children in their various activities.



JOHN LARSON

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER
SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP

John Larson is chief financial officer for Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), which includes the Utah Jazz, the Utah Mammoth, Delta Center and SEG Media. Over the past several years, Larson has undertaken significant responsibilities related to major moves within the organization. In 2019, he helped with the transition and sale of the Utah Jazz by the Miller Family to Ryan and Ashley Smith, which sparked the onset of SEG and a new era in the growth of Utah's sports and entertainment landscape. He also played a key role in guiding the Utah Jazz through the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. Recently, Larson played a key role in the capital and debt structure related to acquisition of Utah's first-ever NHL franchise, the Utah Mammoth, and their future training and practice facility at the South Town Mall. Larson is also involved in the financing of the future renovation of the Delta Center and redevelopment of the surrounding district.

Larson's tenure with the organization dates back to 1991, when it was under ownership of the Miller Family. He started as group controller of Larry H. Miller Sports and Entertainment (LHMSE), and was later promoted to vice president of finance for the organization. In 2009, Larson was asked to oversee Miller Performance, responsible for its two operational units: Miller Motorsports Park and the Ford Performance Racing School. Under his leadership, Miller Performance experienced a significant turnaround after Larson initiated a major restructure of the company, creating new business models, securing new partnerships, and establishing industry-leading programs.

Prior to working for LHMSE, Larson worked for Price Waterhouse's Salt Lake City office. He is a certified public accountant and a graduate of the University of Utah, where he received a bachelor's degree in science and a master's degree in accounting.

Larson currently serves as chairman of the University of Utah Health Board. In addition, he served for seven years on the Olympic Legacy Foundation Board. He also established the sports business program at the University of Utah and taught classes there for several years.



MIKE MAUGHAN

EXECUTIVE, SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP

Mike Maughan serves as an executive at Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), leading organizational efforts across all facets of the company including the Utah Jazz, Utah Mammoth, Delta Center, SEG Media, The Shops at Southtown, and other sports and entertainment related properties. He is also the project principal leading SEG's efforts to reimagine downtown Salt Lake City by developing a Sports, Entertainment, Culture, and Convention District.

Maughan was instrumental in working with Ryan and Ashley Smith in the purchase of the Utah Jazz and establishment of Smith Entertainment Group. Prior to SEG, Maughan spent 12 years at Qualtrics, helping grow the company from 300 employees with one office in Provo, Utah and \$50M in revenue to 3000 employees with over 25 offices worldwide and over \$1B in revenue. When he left Qualtrics he was serving as president of the chairman's office at Qualtrics. He played a central role in taking the company through two IPO processes and Qualtrics' acquisition by SAP, which was the largest private enterprise software acquisition in history at the time.

From 2022 to 2025, Maughan co-hosted the Freakonomics Radio podcast, No Stupid Questions alongside New York Times #1 Best-selling Author of Grit, Angela Duckworth. At the time Duckworth and Maughan left the show, the podcast had accumulated more than 50 million downloads from listeners in over 200 countries.

In 2015, Maughan co-founded 5 For The Fight, inviting everyone to give \$5 for the fight against cancer. 5 For The Fight became the first cause-related jersey sponsorship in the history of North American professional sports and raised over \$50M for cancer research. He also serves as the president of the SEG Foundation which provides donations, activations, and recognition to Utah communities and includes the Utah Jazz Scholarship program, which provides full cost of attendance scholarships, mentorship, and continued professional development support to underserved youth in Utah.

Maughan earned an MBA at Northwestern's Kellogg School of Management and an MPA at the Harvard Kennedy School of Government where he also taught public speaking and communications. He received his bachelor's degree from Brigham Young University. He is an aspiring surfer, average cyclist, and decent hiker.



JIM OLSON

PRESIDENT, UTAH JAZZ

Jim Olson serves as president of the Utah Jazz, an entity of Smith Entertainment Group (SEG). In this position, he provides strategic leadership for the organization's assets – which include the Utah Jazz NBA franchise, the Utah Mammoth, Delta Center, SEG Media, and the Salt Lake City Stars NBA G League team – and also oversees all day-to-day business operations.

Olson joined the Utah Jazz in 1994 when it was under the ownership of Larry H. Miller Sports & Entertainment (LHMSE) and has held multiple positions during his tenure, including vice president of ticket sales (2003-06), senior vice president of sales and marketing (2006-2013), chief operating officer of LHMSE (2013-15), and president of Vivint Arena (2015-2019). Within one year of being named president of LHMSE in October 2019, he played a critical role in helping the organization achieve two major wins. First, he helped the Utah Jazz win the bid to host the 2023 NBA All-Star Game, and, in fall 2020, he supported the seamless transition of ownership when Ryan Smith purchased the company from LHMSE, a move that kicked off a new era for the Utah Jazz. Additionally, Olson has had key management responsibilities for other entities that have fallen within the organization's portfolio including the Salt Lake Bees, The Zone Sports Network, and the Tour of Utah.

Currently, Olson serves on both the Utah Olympic Legacy Foundation board and the Salt Lake City Police Foundation Board. He has also served on the University of Utah's Alumni Association Board of Directors and Crimson Club Board, the Salt Lake Chamber Board of Governors, and the boards for the Downtown Alliance, Visit Salt Lake, and Camp Kostopulos.

A native and long-time resident of Salt Lake City, Olson graduated from the University of Utah with a bachelor's degree in communications. He also achieved a master's degree in sports and recreation management from Northeastern University in Boston.



ANDRÉ TOURIGNY HEAD COACH

André Tourigny, entering his second season with the Utah Mammoth, is the franchise's first head coach. Tourigny was named head coach of the Arizona Coyotes on July 1, 2021, and continued in his role upon Smith Entertainment Group's acquisition of their new NHL team in April 2024.

Tourigny has played an integral role since his appointment in helping develop Clayton Keller, Lawson Crouse, Dylan Guenther, Logan Cooley, Jack McBain, Barrett Hayton, and Karel Vejmelka into core players for the organization.

Currently the fourth-longest tenured head coach in the NHL, Tourigny coached Utah to a 38-31-13 (89 points) mark which marked a 12-point improvement from the previous season. He also coached the Coyotes to a 13-point improvement from 2021-22 to 2022-23 and a seven-point jump in 2023-24.

Tourigny is one of three coaches in NHL history to have improved seven or more points in each of their first four seasons as an NHL head coach, alongside John Tortorella (TBL) and Martin St. Louis (MTL).

On the international level, Tourigny was the head coach for Team Canada at the 2024 and 2023 IIHF World Championship where he helped lead Canada to a gold medal in 2023, with a team that included Crouse, McBain, and Michael Carcone. Tourigny also was an assistant coach on Team Canada's staff at the 2022 World Championship, when they earned a silver medal, and in 2021 when they won a gold medal.

Tourigny's experience with Hockey Canada also includes guiding the junior team to a silver medal as head coach at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship. He previously won a gold medal as an assistant coach at the 2020 IIHF World Junior Championship as well as silver medals as an assistant in 2010 and 2011.

In addition to his five appearances at the World Juniors, Tourigny led Canada's National Men's Summer Under-18 Team to a gold medal as head coach at the 2018 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and won gold as an assistant at the 2008 Ivan Hlinka tournament.

Tourigny joined the Ottawa 67's of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL) as head coach and vice president of hockey operations prior to the 2017-18 season. He was the recipient of the Matt Leyden Trophy as OHL coach of the year in back-to-back seasons (2018-19 and 2019-20) as well as the Brian Kilrea Coach of the Year Award as CHL Coach of the Year (2019-20).

Previously, Tourigny also spent three seasons as an NHL assistant coach with the Colorado Avalanche (2013-15) and the Ottawa Senators (2015-16).

The veteran coach was with the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies (2002-13) for 11 seasons and with the Halifax Mooseheads (2016-17) of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) for one season. In his 11 years with Rouyn-Noranda, Tourigny's team qualified for the playoffs in all but one season while he posted a 337-336-20 record in 693 regular season games. In 2005-06, Tourigny received the QMJHL Ron Lapointe Coach of the Year Award.



MARIO DUHAMEL

ASSISTANT COACH

Mario Duhamel begins his second season as assistant coach with the Utah Mammoth. He joined the Arizona Coyotes organization in the same role on September 13, 2021.

Duhamel came to Arizona from the Ottawa 67's where he served as an associate coach under André Tourigny since 2017-18.

The native of Saint-Bruno, QC previously spent time with the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL). He began his junior coaching career in 2005 with the Huskies as an assistant coach.

Duhamel was named head coach of the Drummondville Voltigeurs of the QMJHL in 2009. He amassed a 162-87-23 record over his four seasons with Drummondville and was a finalist for the QMJHL Ron Lapointe Coach of the Year Award in 2009-10 and 2010-11.

He joined the Colorado Avalanche as the team's video coach under Patrick Roy for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 seasons. Tourigny was also an assistant coach on Roy's staff for those two seasons.

In 2015, Duhamel returned to Rouyn-Noranda as the team's assistant general manager. The Huskies won the QMJHL's President Cup and made an appearance in the Memorial Cup Championship.

Duhamel has also coached at the international level with Canada including as an assistant coach at the 2011, 2012 and 2019 Ivan Hlinka U18 Championships and the 2013 World Junior Championships.



JOHN MADDEN

ASSISTANT COACH

John Madden has been an assistant coach on Andre Tourigny's staff since July 26, 2022, beginning with the Arizona Coyotes and now with the Utah Mammoth.

Madden joined the Coyotes from the San Jose Sharks where he served as an assistant coach from 2020-22. He was named to San Jose's coaching staff on September 22, 2020.

Madden spent three seasons as head coach of the Cleveland Monsters (AHL) from 2016-19. He guided Cleveland to a 101-99-19-9 record in his three seasons, including an appearance in the second round of the Calder Cup Playoffs in 2018-19.

The Toronto, Ontario native previously worked parts of three seasons with the Florida Panthers as an assistant coach from 2013-16. Madden also spent time as a pro scout with the Panthers and Montreal Canadiens following his retirement in 2012.

The 13-year NHL veteran registered 165-183-348 in 898 career NHL games with the New Jersey Devils, Chicago Blackhawks, Minnesota Wild and Panthers.

Madden is a three-time Stanley Cup Champion after winning with New Jersey in 2000 and 2003 and with Chicago in 2010. He won the NHL's Frank J. Selke Trophy as the League's top defensive forward with the Devils in 2001 and finished second in voting in 2003, 2004 and 2008.

Madden played four years at the University of Michigan where he set the NCAA record for most career shorthanded goals (23). He was a member of the 1996 NCAA championship team and was selected to the CCHA First All-Star and NCAA West First All-American Teams during his final season. Madden also led the Wolverines to three Central Collegiate Hockey Association titles.



BLAINE FORSYTHE

ASSISTANT COACH

Blaine Forsythe transferred to Utah from the Arizona Coyotes, where he joined the organization as an assistant coach on July 12, 2023.

Forsythe came to Arizona from the Washington Capitals where he served as an assistant coach since 2009-10.

The Calgary, Alberta native was responsible for the Capitals team centers and power play, which ranked as the best in the NHL (21.8%) under his guidance from 2009-10 through 2022-23. The Capitals ranked in the top-10 in the NHL in eight of the last 12 seasons and were the top-ranked unit in 2009-10, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15. During the 2018 Stanley Cup playoffs, the Capitals power play converted at a 29.3% mark in 24 games to help the club win the franchise's first ever Stanley Cup.

Forsythe took over the responsibility of working with the team's centers prior to the 2014-15 season and helped improve the team's face-off win percentage from 48.4% to 51.2% the next season.

Forsythe joined the Capitals as a video coach prior to the 2006-07 season and was an integral member of the Capitals staff that helped lead the Capitals to the 2007-08 Southeast Division championship. He was promoted to a position as an amateur scout in 2008-09 before returning to the coaching staff in 2009-10. In his first season back as an assistant coach, Forsythe helped the team win the Presidents' Trophy and the Southeast Division championship.

Prior to joining the Washington organization, the Calgary, Alberta, native worked for the Calgary Hitmen from 1998-2006, where he served as both an assistant general manager (1998-06) and an assistant coach (2002-06). Forsythe helped lead Calgary to a WHL championship in 1999.

Forsythe received a business degree from the University of Minnesota and played Division II hockey at the University of Minnesota, Crookston. He played junior hockey with the CJHL's Pembroke Lumber Kings in Pembroke, Ontario.

Forsythe and his wife, Ivy, have a daughter, Sloan, and a sons, Bodhi and Cash.



COREY SCHWAB

GOALTENDING COACH

Corey Schwab enters his second season with the organization after spending 10 years with the Arizona Coyotes and eight seasons as the Coyotes' NHL goaltending coach.

Last season, goaltender Karel Vejmelka had a breakout campaign in his fourth season working with Schwab, winning a career-high 26 games and being rewarded with a five-year contract extension. Vejmelka also started 23 consecutive games which was the longest streak in the NHL since the 2014-15 season.

Connor Ingram had a career year under Schwab's tutelage winning 23 games and posting six shutouts which were tied for the NHL lead in 2023-24. Ingram was also named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 3. He stopped 89 of the 94 shots he faced, going 3-0-0 with a 1.63 goals-against average and .947 save percentage to help the Coyotes extend their winning streak to four games, all against the past four Stanley Cup champions. Ingram also won the NHL's Masterton Trophy at the end of the season.

In 2022-23, Ingram stopped 47 shots against the defending Eastern Conference champion Tampa Bay Lightning to record his first career shutout, which set an NHL record for most saves in a goaltender's first NHL shutout. Ingram surpassed teammate Karel Vejmelka's 46 save performance against the Winnipeg Jets from the previous season to set the new NHL mark. San Jose Sharks goaltender Troy Grosenick 45 save shutout in 2014 ranks fourth in NHL history and also came under Schwab's watch.

In 2021-22, Schwab helped Vejmelka finish second among NHL rookie goaltenders in games played, shots against, saves and minutes. He also tied for fifth in wins.

Between 2017-2020, Schwab helped Coyotes' goaltenders finish among the NHL's leaders in both GAA and SV%. In 2019-20, Kuemper finished third with a 2.22 GAA and .928 SV% and was named to the Pacific Division team for the 2020 NHL All-Star Game. In 2018-19, Kuemper ranked sixth with a 2.33 GAA and a .925 SV%. During the 2017-18 regular season Antti Raanta finished second in the League with a 2.24 GAA and a .930 SV%.

Schwab spent seven seasons with the San Jose Sharks organization as a goaltending development coach where he oversaw the goaltending coaching duties for Sharks prospects. The North Battleford, Saskatchewan native also spent three seasons (2005-08) as associate goaltending coach and scout for the Tampa Bay Lightning.

Schwab played eight NHL seasons and registered a 42-63-13 record with a 2.89 GAA and an .896 SV% in 147 games with the New Jersey Devils, Lightning, Vancouver Canucks, and Toronto Maple Leafs. He was a member of the 2003 Stanley Cup Champion New Jersey Devils, as well as the 1995 Calder Cup Champion Albany River Rats.

NHL SKILLS COACH

Kyle Bocek is in his fifth season as an NHL skills coach and his second in the role with the Utah Mammoth. He originally joined Andre Tourigny's coaching staff in Arizona in September 2021 and plays an integral role in developing player's skills in the NHL. His detailed process and personal approach with Utah players helps elevate their individual success within the team environment and structure.

The Port Severn, Ontario native has worked as a skills coach for over 15 years, including with his own development company. He most recently worked with the Ottawa 67's of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL), the Carleton Ravens (CIS) and Next Generation Hockey training junior, AHL, NHL, European Pro and elite level players in Ottawa.

Bocek played four years of Jr. A/OHL in Ontario and seven years of professional hockey in North America and Europe while continuing his skills development company.

Bocek lives with his wife, Kylie, and dog, Lulu, while continuing his passion of training players year-round all over the world.



BRIAN SLUGOCKI

ASSISTANT SKILLS COACH

Brian Slugocki is in his first year with the Utah Mammoth and third year in the organization after spending the past two years working as the skills coach for the Tucson Roadrunners. The Scottsdale, Arizona native has been working as a skills coach since 2015 after finishing his playing career with The University of Arizona.

Slugocki lives with his wife, Kelsey, their two sons, and their dog, Charlie. He holds a bachelor of arts in psychology from The University of Arizona.



HUNTER CHERNI

HEAD VIDEO COORDINATOR

Hunter Cherni is in his second season as Utah's head video coordinator. He previously spent four seasons with the Arizona Coyotes in the same role.

Cherni joined the Coyotes from the Boston Bruins where he spent the 2019-20 season as the team's assistant video coordinator. He previously worked for the Providence Bruins of the American Hockey League (AHL) as their video analyst and team services representative from 2015 to 2019.

DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Lee Stempniak enters his second season with the Utah Mammoth as the team's director of player development. He previously spent two years with the Arizona Coyotes in the same role and one season as the club's hockey data strategist.

He oversees the development of the organization's drafted prospects as well as the development of players in the Mammoth minor league system.

Stempniak came to Arizona's front office following a distinguished NHL playing career that spanned 14 seasons and 10 different teams including the Coyotes from 2009-11.

A former All-American and NCAA Academic All-American at Dartmouth College, Stempniak was an economics major and combined his vast hockey experience and education to assist in the communication between the club's analytics department with coaches, players, and management. Stempniak also earned the Kenneth Archibald Prize while in school which is Dartmouth's highest athletic honor given to the member of the graduating class who has been four years in attendance, best all-around athlete with regards to moral worth and high standing in scholarship.

The West Seneca, New York native registered 203-266-469 in 911 career NHL games with the Coyotes, St. Louis Blues, Calgary Flames, Toronto Maple Leafs, Boston Bruins, Carolina Hurricanes, Pittsburgh Penguins, New York Rangers, Winnipeg Jets, and New Jersey Devils. He collected 33-23-56 in 100 games with the Coyotes from 2010-11.

He and his wife, Lindsay, have twin daughters Reese and Lucy, and a son, Brooks.



NATHANIEL BROOKS

SKILL DEVELOPMENT COACH

Nathaniel Brooks was named the skills development coach on July 14, 2022 with the Arizona Coyotes and remains in the same position with the Utah Mammoth.

Brooks has been a skill development coach for over 15 years with experience training players from minor hockey to the NHL level. He has also served as an associate coach, assistant coach, and development coach for Toronto Metropolitan University (Formerly Ryerson Rams) Men's Hockey team from 2014-2022. During that time the team became a perennially top ranked contender in Canada winning 3 OUA regular season titles. In 2021-2022 he helped the team earn their first berth to the national championship tournament, losing in the final four game to UQTR. That season Brooks led the penalty kill that finished number one in the country at a 92% efficiency rate.

In addition, Brooks has served as the head of coaching and development for the Forest Hill Hockey Association and Don Mills Flyers. In 2019, he was presented with the Herb Ebisuzaki Coach of the year Award (GTHL). He has presented at the Coaches Site Conference twice (Toronto/Michigan). Brooks also played hockey at various levels during his career including the GTHL, OJHL, OHL, USHL, and semi-professional levels.

In September 2021, Brooks participated in the first year of the Coyotes' coaching internship program that provides young diverse hockey coaches with opportunities to learn and develop by working directly with Tourigny and his coaching staff during Development Camp.

Foster begins his second season as Utah's player development coach. He previously spent two seasons in the same role with the Arizona Coyotes.

Foster's coaching resume also includes stints as an assistant coach with the Peterborough Petes (2016-17) and the Kingston Frontenacs (2017-20), including serving as the Frontenacs head coach from 2018-20.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT COACH

Shantz enters his second season as Utah's player development coach. He previously spent two seasons in the same role with the Arizona Coyotes.

Shantz spent four seasons coaching the Canadian Sport School Hockey League's Edge School U15 Prep team, capped by a semi-final appearance at the 2022 CSSHL Western Championship.

The Duchess, Alberta native enjoyed a 642-game NHL career that spanned 10 seasons with the Chicago Blackhawks, Calgary Flames and Colorado Avalanche. During his playing career, Shantz recorded 72-139-211 from 1993-2003.



LARS HEPSON
SKATING COACH

Lars Hepso is in his second season as the skating coach for the Utah Mammoth. He previously spent six seasons with the Arizona Coyotes, joining the club on June 28, 2018 in the same role.

Hepso is the Founder & President of Skate with Power. The 33-year-old works with all Utah Hockey Club's team players at the NHL, AHL, and junior levels.

The Penticton, BC native is in his 17th year as a skating instructor and graduated with a business management degree from UBC Okanagan.



ALAN HEPPLE

DIRECTOR OF PRO SCOUTING

Alan Hepple was named director of pro scouting on July 6, 2021 for the Arizona Coyotes and transferred to Utah during the franchise's relocation.

Hepple joined the Coyotes following 19 seasons with the Colorado Avalanche, who won the 2021 Presidents' Trophy, which is awarded to the team with the best record in the NHL regular season. He most recently was the team's director of amateur scouting after being promoted to that post on July 1, 2015.

Since Hepple assumed the role of director of amateur scouting in 2015, the Avalanche made several notable draft choices including Bowen Byram (2019), Alex Newhook (2019), Cale Makar (2017), Tyson Jost (2016), and Mikko Rantanen (2015).

Hepple joined the Avalanche organization as an amateur scout in February 2002 and was named assistant director of amateur scouting in 2009.

Prior to his time with the Avalanche, Hepple spent four years as an amateur scout with the Nashville Predators. He also worked one year as an associate coach with the Utica Blizzard of the Colonial Hockey League in 1996-97.

The former defenseman was drafted by the New Jersey Devils (ninth round, 169th overall) in the 1982 NHL Entry Draft. He played in three games with the Devils from 1983-86. Hepple also appeared in 585 American Hockey League (AHL) contests with the Maine Mariners, Utica Devils, and Newmarket Saints.



DARRYL PLANDOWSKI

DIRECTOR OF AMATEUR SCOUTING

Darryl Plandowski is the director of amateur scouting for the Utah Mammoth where he was originally named to the position on October 1, 2020 while with the Arizona Coyotes.

Plandowski joined the Coyotes following 12 seasons with the 2020 Stanley Cup Champion Tampa Bay Lightning where he most recently was the team's assistant director of amateur scouting. He was named to that post on August 1, 2019 and helped manage the team's amateur scouting staff. The veteran scout previously spent 11 seasons as Tampa Bay's head amateur scout.

Prior to joining the Lightning, Plandowski worked two seasons as an amateur scout with the Pittsburgh Penguins. Before that, he spent eight years in a similar role for the Buffalo Sabres. He also was a member of the Seattle Thunderbirds organization of the Western Hockey League including four seasons as a scout and two as an assistant coach.

Plandowski played college hockey at Northern Michigan University from 1987 to 1991, totaling 53-78-131 in 166 career games.

DIRECTOR OF EUROPEAN PRO SCOUTING

Brett Stewart enters his second season as director of European pro scouting for the Utah Mammoth. He spent eight seasons in the same position with the Arizona Coyotes. Stewart was previously a coach and general manager for Skien and Tonsberg in the Norwegian Hockey League.

Prior to beginning his coaching career, Stewart enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career which included stints in Germany, Austria, Sweden, and Norway. The Regina, Saskatchewan native also skated in five games with Canada's National Team in 1996-97. He retired as a player in 2002.

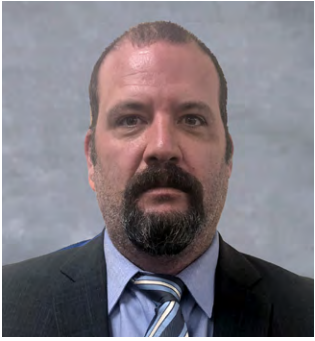

RYAN WYSOCKI

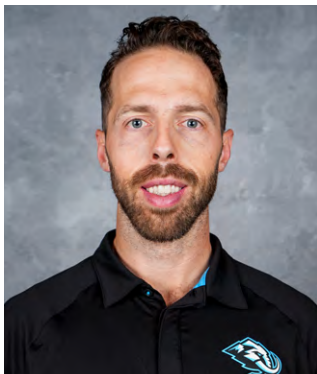
ASSISTANT PERFORMANCE COACH

TUCSON ROADRUNNERS COACHING STAFF



STEVE POTVIN

HEAD COACH - TUCSON ROADRUNNERS

Steve Potvin was named head coach of the Tucson Roadrunners, the Arizona Coyotes' American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate on August 16, 2022. The Roadrunners remained Utah's affiliate after Smith Entertainment Group's acquisition of the Coyotes in April 2024.

Potvin enters his ninth season with the Roadrunners where he was named assistant coach prior to the 2017-2018 season. He was named associate head coach for the 2021-2022 season.

As Roadrunners assistant coach, the team captured Pacific Division championships during the 2017-2018 and 2019-2020 seasons and have made three consecutive playoff berths since Potvin took over behind the bench permanently in 2022-23. In addition, 23 Roadrunners have made their NHL debuts with Arizona and Utah since Potvin joined the Tucson staff.

Last season, Potvin led the Roadrunners to a third consecutive playoff season, leading Tucson to a 34-32-4-2 mark. The Roadrunners finished ninth in the AHL with a 19.6 PP%, which was the highest mark under Potvin as a Head Coach.

The Roadrunners again qualified for the Calder Cup playoffs in 2023-24, falling to the Calgary Wranglers in the first round. Goaltender Matt Villalta led the AHL with 31 wins while forward Josh Doan led all AHL rookies with 26 goals scored. Both players were named to the 2024 AHL All-Star Game and made their NHL debuts for the Arizona Coyotes.

In 2022-23, Tucson qualified for the Calder Cup playoffs in the club's first season under Potvin, falling to the Coachella Valley Firebirds in three games. Under Potvin, Roadrunners forward Michael Carcone led the AHL in scoring with 31-54-85 in 65 games played, winning the Jon B. Sollenberger Trophy. Carcone set franchise records in goals, assists, points, and power-play goals (14).

During the 2021-2022 season, Tucson's power-play, under the direction of Potvin, set a team record by converting on 21.5-percent of their chances and finishing seventh in the 31-team American Hockey League in that department. The 2019-2020 Roadrunners finished fourth in the league in goals-per-game at 3.41 and featured three of the league's top 15 scorers under Potvin's direction of the forwards.

Potvin worked with the Coyotes as a skills coach in 2016-2017, focusing on player assessment and individual skill improvement with players at both the NHL and AHL levels.

Potvin joined the Coyotes after a 16-year professional career that included 478 professional American Hockey League (AHL) and top European league games.

The former forward registered 31-44-75 in 158 career AHL contests. Potvin collected 133 goals and 184 assists in 350 games over 10 seasons in Europe.

Steve and his wife, Nada, have three children: Max, Nash, and Eliana.

JOHN SLANEY

ASSISTANT COACH - TUCSON ROADRUNNERS

John Slaney is in his ninth season as an assistant coach with the Tucson Roadrunners. Slaney previously spent two seasons as an assistant coach with the Arizona Coyotes and four seasons as an assistant coach with the Portland Pirates (AHL). He started with the Pirates in 2011-12 after finishing his playing career with Plzen HC (Czech) following the 2010-11 season.

Leaving his mark as one of the best defensemen in AHL history, Slaney began his coaching career with a wealth of accolades. He was a two-time recipient of the Eddie Shore Award (given annually to the AHL's top defenseman) with the Philadelphia Phantoms in the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons. He also won a Calder Cup championship with the Phantoms in 2005.

He was inducted into the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins Hall of Fame in 2016. A member of the Penguins inaugural team, Slaney appeared in 89 games with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton during parts of two seasons (1999-2001), recording 42-68-110.

Slaney became the AHL's all-time leading scorer as a defenseman in 2005-06 until his mark (519 career points) was surpassed by Oklahoma City's Bryan Helmer. Slaney also played in 29 games and posted 14-13-27 for Portland during the 1993-94 Calder Cup championship season.

During his career in the NHL, Slaney totaled 22-69-91 in 268 games with the Washington Capitals (1993-95), Colorado Avalanche (1995-96), Los Angeles Kings (1995-97), Phoenix Coyotes (1997-98), Nashville Predators (1998-99), Pittsburgh Penguins (1999-00), and Philadelphia Flyers (2001-02; 2003-04). Slaney also skated in 14 games for the Capitals (1993-94), Penguins (1999-00), and Flyers (2001-02) during the Stanley Cup Playoffs where he netted two goals and registered an assist.

The native of St. John's, Newfoundland was originally drafted by Washington in the first round (ninth overall) of the 1990 NHL Entry Draft.

He and his wife, Brenda, have a son, Tyler, and daughter, Julia.



ZACK STORTINI

ASSISTANT COACH - TUCSON ROADRUNNERS

Zack Stortini joined the Tucson Roadrunners in August of 2022 as an assistant coach.

He came to Tucson from the Sudbury Wolves of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL) where he served as an associate coach.

He transitioned to coaching as an assistant coach with Sudbury in 2019-2020 after a 14-year professional career that included 860 professional games; with 257 in the NHL with Edmonton and Nashville and 603 in the AHL.

Stortini retired as a player in 2019, after winning his second career Calder Cup Championship in his third trip to the finals, as a member of the AHL's Charlotte Checkers.

The Ontario native was originally drafted by the Edmonton Oilers in 2003 and won a Calder Cup in 2007 with the Hamilton Bulldogs.

Stortini led the American Hockey League in penalty minutes with 299 during the 2013-2014 season with Norfolk. Since 2003, he is second in the AHL in penalty minutes with 1,825 and ranks 16th overall in AHL history in penalty minutes. He served as captain of the Binghamton Senators in 2015-2016 and was also a three-time nominee for the Yanick Dupre AHL Man of the Year Award for his contributions to his local community and charitable organizations.

DIRECTOR OF HOCKEY OPERATIONS & VIDEO - TUCSON ROADRUNNERS

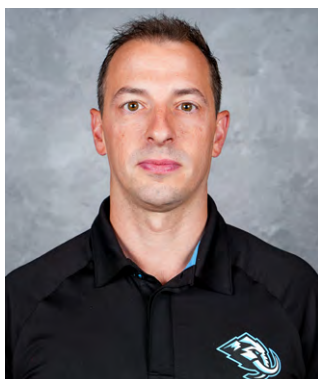
Jake Wagman enters his fifth season with the Tucson Roadrunners as the team's director of hockey operations & video.

Before that, he was the goaltending coach for SC Bern (NL). He also spent six seasons with the University of Vermont as an assistant coach and director of hockey operations.



MATT MCCONNELL

TELEVISION PLAY-BY-PLAY ANNOUNCER

Matt McConnell enters his second season with Utah as the team's TV play-by-play announcer.

Prior to joining the Utah broadcast team, McConnell was the TV voice of the Arizona Coyotes for 13 seasons. He also called all the TV play-by-play for the Atlanta Thrashers over two separate stints (2009-2011) and from 1999 (their inaugural season in the NHL) through 2003 before moving on to the Minnesota Wild where he called NHL action for two seasons (2003-2005).

During the 2018-19 season, McConnell called his 1,500th NHL game on January 20, 2019 (Coyotes at Maple Leafs) and is set to reach his 2,000th NHL game milestone in the 2025-26 season.

McConnell got his start in the NHL in 1993 when he was named as the radio voice of the expansion Mighty Ducks of Anaheim. He worked with the Ducks through 1996, before becoming the radio play-by-play announcer for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 1996-1999. McConnell has also covered the NHL playoffs for NHL Radio and Westwood One, the Stanley Cup Final for NHL International and the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship for the NHL Network.

From 2005-06 to 2008-09, he served as the lead play-by-play announcer for CBS College Sports' college hockey broadcasts. During this time, McConnell also called college basketball, football, and lacrosse for the network and hosted their coverage of the NCAA lacrosse championships. He also played the role of fill-in broadcaster for the NBA on TNT in 2001. In addition to his involvement with CBSSN, he also calls games for Pac-12 Networks on a freelance basis.

McConnell's accolades in the broadcasting industry include being named the 2013 Arizona Sports Broadcaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association (he was a finalist for the same award in 2020). He also won a pair of regional sports Emmys involving his work on Thrashers telecasts in 2002 and 2003, was nominated for a regional sports Emmy in 2010, and was a finalist for 1994 Broadcaster of the Year by the Southern California Sports Broadcasters Association while working for the Ducks.

McConnell is a graduate of Michigan State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in telecommunication with major emphasis in economics. He previously taught a sports broadcasting course as a faculty advisor at Arizona State University's Walter Cronkite School of Journalism & Mass Communication.

DOMINIC MOORE

TELEVISION ANALYST

Dominic Moore enters his second season with Utah as one of the team's TV analysts.

Moore joined the Utah Mammoth after spending three seasons as an NHL analyst for NBC and ESPN television broadcasts, providing insight from the play-by-play booth, between the benches and in the studio.

A native of Thornhill, Ontario, Moore played 15 professional hockey seasons from 2003-19. He recorded 282 points (106g, 176a) in 897 career NHL games over parts of 13 seasons with NY Rangers, Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Toronto, Buffalo, Florida, Montreal, Tampa Bay, San Jose, and Boston. Moore served as an alternate captain for the Maple Leafs in 2008-09. Before turning pro, he played four collegiate seasons at Harvard from 1999-03, earning ECAC First All-Star Team honors as a junior before captaining the Crimson as a senior.

Moore stepped away from hockey in 2012-13 to care for his wife, Katie, who died after a nine-month battle with a rare form of liver cancer. He returned to the NHL with New York in 2013-14 and scored the only goal in Game 6 of the 2014 Eastern Conference Final against Montreal, sending the Rangers to their first Stanley Cup Final in 20 years. In recognition of his perseverance, sportsmanship, and dedication to hockey, Moore was awarded the NHL's Bill Masterton Trophy.

Moore has two older brothers, Mark and Steve, who also played college hockey at Harvard. Steve played 69 career NHL games over parts of three seasons with Colorado, but his career was cut short due to a concussion suffered in March 2004. The Steve Moore Foundation was established in 2011, focused on preventing and treating sport-related concussions and other serious head and neck injuries. Two years later, Dominic established the Katie Moore Foundation in honor of his late wife, to fund life-saving, collaborative research into rare forms of cancer. With help from countless NHL players and alumni, Moore has hosted Smashfest, an annual charity ping-pong tournament benefiting both foundations and their causes, since 2012.



NICK OLCZYK

TELEVISION ANALYST

Nick Olczyk enters his second season with Utah as one of the team's TV and radio analysts.

Olczyk spent the previous two seasons with the Seattle Kraken as a television color analyst before joining Utah prior to the club's inaugural season. He appeared between the benches for in-game commentary and provided both pre- and postgame studio analysis breaking down and teaching the game of hockey. During his time in Seattle, Olczyk also appeared on Sports USA Radio as a lead analyst and reporter for NHL Winter Classics and Stadium Series as well as the Stanley Cup Playoffs. He began his NHL tenure during the 2021-22 season, providing television and radio analysis for the Chicago Blackhawks.

Olczyk started his professional broadcasting career as the lead color analyst for the ECHL's Indy Fuel from 2018-22, and during that time, he also broadcasted college hockey games on NBC Sports Network. In addition to his on-camera experience, he has also worked as an associate producer for NBC Sports Chicago and NHL on TNT broadcasts, as well as producing some of NBC Sports' Olympics coverage in both 2020 and 2022.

Olczyk played two seasons of Division I hockey at Colorado College from 2017-19. He also played for the USPHL's South Shore Kings and NAHL's Minnesota Wilderness from 2015-17, and spent parts of two USHL seasons with Waterloo and Chicago from 2014-15.

Nash has also served as an analyst on NHL Network during the regular season and Stanley Cup Playoffs in previous seasons. In the past, Nash has worked with FOX Sports 1 as a panelist for its coverage of the 2015 Stanley Cup Playoffs. He has also worked as the color analyst on Pac-12 Network for select Arizona State hockey games.

A native of Edmonton, Alberta, Nash enjoyed a standout junior hockey career with the Kamloops Blazers of the Western Hockey League (WHL) where he won three Memorial Cup Championships and was a teammate of former Coyotes Captain Shane Doan. Nash and Doan helped lead Kamloops to back-to-back Memorial Cup Championships in 1994 and 1995 while Nash was also a part of Kamloops' 1992 Memorial Cup-winning team.

Nash and his wife, Kathy, have two daughters, Madison and Georgia, and a son, Ty.

UTAH HOCKEY CLUB (2024-25)

APRIL 18, 2024	The National Hockey League (NHL) announces the establishment of a new NHL franchise in Utah to be owned and controlled by Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), which is owned by Ryan and Ashley Smith. Utah's NHL team will begin competing at Delta Center in the 2024–25 season.
APRIL 24, 2024	Fans celebrate Utah's new NHL franchise at Delta Center, where they are introduced to General Manager Bill Armstrong, Head Coach André Tourigny and the players for the first time.
JUNE 7, 2024	Season tickets go on sale for Utah's inaugural season.
JUNE 13, 2024	The NHL and SEG officially close on the agreement that establishes an NHL franchise in Utah and announce the organization's color palette that consists of Rock Black, representing the darkness of night in the mountains and the volcanic rock of Utah's deserts; Salt White, illustrating both the snow on Utah's peaks and the famous salt flats; and Mountain Blue, a representation of Utah's rich winter sports history.
JUNE 17, 2024	Forward Noel Nordh becomes the first contract signing in franchise history.
JUNE 18, 2024	SEG appoints Chris Armstrong as the franchise's first president of hockey operations. Armstrong will also serve as an alternate governor.
JUNE 28, 2024	Forwards Tij Iginla (6th overall) and Cole Beaudoin (24th overall) become the first draft picks in franchise history during the first round of the 2024 NHL Draft at the Sphere in Las Vegas.
JUNE 29, 2024	Utah acquires defenseman Mikhail Sergachev from Tampa Bay in exchange for defenseman J.J. Moser, forward Conor Geekie and two draft choices.
JULY 12, 2024	Single-game tickets go on sale for Utah's inaugural season.
AUGUST 1, 2024	SEG acquires The Shops at South Town in Sandy, Utah. The 111-acre site will be home to Utah Hockey Club's permanent state-of-the-art practice and training facility, scheduled for completion in 2025.
AUGUST 12, 2024	SEG hosts a groundbreaking event with Ryan Smith, Chris Armstrong, Bill Armstrong, André Tourigny, Lawson Crouse, Nick Bjugstad, and Michael Carcone at The Shops at South Town, the future site of Utah's training and practice facility.

APRIL 10, 2025	Utah Hockey Club announces the first-ever Utah Hockey Club Honors following the Club's final home game of the regular season. Goaltender Karel Vejmelka is selected as Team MVP by his teammates, forward Clayton Keller finishes as the Club's leading scorer, Dylan Guenther earns the Three Stars Award, Alexander Kerfoot is named the team's Community-Obsessed Award winner and forward Barrett Hayton is chosen by fans as the recipient of the All-In Award.
MAY 5, 2025	Utah Hockey Club jumps from 14th to fourth in the NHL Draft Lottery after winning the second draw with the combination of 1-3-5-12. The Club had a 1.5% chance of winning the first draw (15/1,000) and a 1.6% chance of winning the second draw (15/965).

UTAH MAMMOTH (2025-PRESENT)

MAY 7, 2025	Smith Entertainment Group reveals the new name and permanent identity of Utah's NHL franchise: the Utah Mammoth. 2024-25 SEASON NOTES

WELCOME TO THE CLUB

- Utah Hockey Club earned a 38-31-13 record in its inaugural season, finishing with the second-most points (89) and the second-highest points percentage (.543) of any NHL franchise in its first season (VGK, 2017-18: 51-24-7, 109 points, .665).
- Utah recorded 18 of its 38 wins in comeback fashion, also the second-most of any first-year franchise (VGK: 23).
- The team also went 57-for-236 on the power play, posting the highest conversion rate (24.2%) of any franchise in its inaugural season since the statistic became official in 1977-78 (EDM, 1979-80: 22.3%).
- Utah registered a season-long, eight-game point streak from 12/7-12/22 (6-0-2) and became just the fifth franchise in NHL history to record a point streak of at least eight games during its inaugural season, joining VGK (2017-18: 13), FLA (1993-94: 9), CBJ (2000-01: 8) and MIN (2000-01: 8).

KELLER INSTINCT

- **Clayton Keller** posted a career-high 90 points (30g, 60a) in 2024-25 and finished as one of just 12 NHL players to reach the 90-point mark in 2024-25. He ranked tied for 11th in the NHL in points and tied for ninth in assists.
- He also set new career highs in assists, power-play goals (10), power-play assists (27) and power-play points (37) while matching his previous high in game-winning goals (5), set with Arizona in 2018-19.
- Keller paced all Utah skaters in goals, assists and points, and he was one of just seven players to lead his team outright in all three major statistical categories, alongside David Pastrnak (BOS), Nathan MacKinnon (COL), Matt Boldy (MIN), Filip Forsberg (NSH), Artemi Panarin (NYR) and Kyle Connor (WPG).
- He also posted the first three-point game (10/12 at NYR: 2g, 1a), four-point game (12/22 vs. ANA: 2g, 2a) and five-point game (2/27 vs. MIN: 1g, 4a) in Utah Hockey Club history, and he led the team in multi-point games (21) and three-point games (6). He was also the only Utah skater to record four or more points in a single contest, accomplishing the feat four times.
- Keller found the scoresheet in 58 of his 81 games and was held without a point in back-to-back contests just once all season (3/27-3/28).

VEGGIE TALES

- **Karel Vejmelka** posted a 26-22-8 record in 2024-25, setting new career highs in games played (58), starts (55), wins (26), goals-against average (2.58) and save percentage (.904). His 58 appearances tied for the sixth-most by any NHL netminder this season.

- He earned his first Utah win vs. CAR (11/13), as he made a career-high and franchise-record 49 saves to help the team to a 4-1 victory. His 49 stops tied Vitek Vanecek (SJS, 11/5 vs. CBJ) for the second-most by any NHL goaltender in a single game this season, trailing only Mackenzie Blackwood's 51-save outing for SJS at FLA (12/7).
- Vejmelka later posted the sixth shutout of his NHL career and his first with Utah at MIN (1/23), stopping all 26 shots faced in net.
- He started 24 of Utah's final 25 games (2/23-4/15), registering a 13-7-4 record over that stretch. His career-long, 23-game streak of starts from 2/23-4/12 (13-6-4) marked the longest such streak by any NHL netminder over the last 10 seasons (2015-25), since Devan Dubnyk (MIN, 1/15/15-4/7/15: 38 starts) and Braden Holtby (WSH, 2/17/15-4/11/15: 25 starts) had longer runs in 2014-15.
- Vejmelka also signed a five-year extension with Utah on 3/6, tying him to the franchise through 2029-30.

98 DEGREES

- **Mikhail Sergachev** tallied 53 points (15g, 38a) in 77 games this season, leading Utah defensemen in goals, assists, points, power-play goals (3), power-play assists (20), power-play points (23) and game-winning goals (3).
- He led the team in takeaways (32) and ranked second in power-play assists, overtime goals (2) and blocked shots (140), fourth in assists and power-play points, tied for fourth in game-winning goals and fifth in points.
- Sergachev logged a career-high 25:07 of ice time per game in 2024-25, ranking sixth in that category among all NHL skaters.
- He also set a new regular-season, single-game career high with 31:03 of ice time vs. ANA (12/22), the highest mark by any Utah skater in a single contest this season. Sergachev logged at least 26:00 of ice time in 26 games in 2024-25, while the rest of the team combined for three such outings (Sean Durzi: 2, Olli Määttä: 1).
- Sergachev's 15 goals marked a new career high (previous: 10g with TBL, twice), as he trailed only Mark Howe (HFD, 1979-80: 24) and Norm MacIver (OTT, 1992-93: 17) for the most goals by any defenseman in a franchise's inaugural season since 1967-68.
- He recorded his 300th career NHL point (59g, 241a) with an assist vs. ANA (3/12), becoming the ninth Russian defenseman in NHL history to reach the milestone. Sergachev also required the third-fewest games of any Russian blueliner to accomplish the feat (535 GP), trailing only Sergei Zubov (NYR/PIT/DAL: 354 GP) and Sergei Gonchar (WSH: 516 GP).

2024-25 SEASON NOTES

LEADING THE WAY

- **Clayton Keller** was named Utah's first-ever captain on 10/4, after serving as an alternate captain for the Coyotes in each of the past two seasons (2022-24).
- **Lawson Crouse**, who had also served as one of Arizona's alternate captains for two seasons, was named Utah's first-ever associate captain. He also previously wore an "A" for Team Canada (2016 IIHF World Junior Championship and 2023 IIHF World Championship) and the OHL's Kingston Frontenacs (2015-16).
- **Alexander Kerfoot**, **Nick Schmaltz** and **Mikhail Sergachev** rotated as the additional alternate captain throughout the 2024-25 season. Schmaltz served as an alternate captain for the Coyotes last season, whereas Kerfoot and Sergachev had never previously worn a letter in their NHL careers. However, Kerfoot captained Harvard for his final collegiate season in 2016-17, and Sergachev served as an alternate captain for Team Russia at the 2016 IIHF Under-18 World Championship.

THE KIDS ARE ALL RIGHT

- **Logan Cooley** (25-40-65) and **Dylan Guenther** (27-33-60) both set new career highs in goals, assists and points in 2024-25, and Utah was the only NHL team with multiple 60-point scorers aged 22 or younger.
- Cooley ranked fifth in points and tied for sixth in goals among all NHL players under 23, while Guenther finished fourth in goals and first in power-play goals (12) among that group.
- Cooley (4/1 vs. CGY: 1a) and Guenther (3/24 vs. DET: 1g) both registered their 100th career NHL points this season, as Guenther became the eighth player from the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the milestone and accomplished the feat in the fewest games (137 GP) of any of those players. Cooley became the second player from the 2022 NHL Draft to reach the century mark.
- At 20 years and 332 days old, Cooley became the seventh active American-born player and the 15th American skater all-time to tally his 100th career NHL point before turning 21. He also became just the ninth U.S.-born player to accomplish the feat since 1988-89, joining Mike Modano (MNS), Jeremy Roenick (CHI), Patrick Kane (CHI), Jack Eichel (BUF), Auston Matthews (TOR), Matthew Tkachuk (CGY), Clayton Keller (ARI) and Jack Hughes (NJD).
- Cooley also became the fifth active American skater to reach the 20-goal mark in multiple seasons at age 20 or younger, alongside Kane (CHI, 2007-08 and 2008-09), Eichel (BUF, 2015-16 and 2016-17), Matthews (TOR, 2016-17 and 2017-18) and Brady Tkachuk (OTT, 2018-19 and 2019-20).

- Both Cooley and Guenther ranked top-five on the team in goals, assists, points, power-play goals, power-play assists and power-play points this season, and Cooley finished third in ice time per game (17:52) and fifth in hits (63) among Utah forwards.

SUPER DYLAN

- **Dylan Guenther** ranked second on the team in goals (27) in 2024-25 while pacing all Utah skaters in power-play goals (12), game-winning goals (9), overtime goals (3) and multi-goal games (6).
- Utah posted an 18-1-2 record when he lit the lamp, and 15 of his 27 goals came in the third period or overtime.
- Guenther also scored a team-high 15 go-ahead goals this season, including seven of his final 10 tallies dating back to 2/4 vs. PHI. His 15 such goals ranked tied for the fifth-most of any NHL skater, behind only Leon Draisaitl (EDM: 24), Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 18), Tage Thompson (BUF: 18) and Sam Reinhart (FLA: 17).
- Guenther's go-ahead goal against the Flyers came with just 0:01 left in overtime, marking the latest game-winning goal by any NHL player in 2024-25. The tally also marked the first of his league-high four game-winning goals in February (8 GP).
- His nine total game-winning goals ranked tied for fifth in the NHL, trailing only Draisaitl (11), Mark Scheifele (WPG: 11), Matt Boldy (MIN: 10) and Sidney Crosby (PIT: 10).
- Guenther signed an eight-year contract extension with Utah during preseason, tying him to the franchise through 2032-33.

2024-25 SEASON NOTES

HAYTERS GONNA HAYT

- **Barrett Hayton** tallied 46 points (20g, 26a) in 82 games with Utah this season and set new career highs in numerous categories, including goals, assists, points, power-play goals (7), power-play points (15), game-winning goals (7), multi-point games (12) and faceoff win percentage (54.1%).
- He ranked sixth on the team in assists and points, fifth in shots on goal (155) and tied for fourth in goals and power-play goals. His seven game-winning tallies also trailed only **Dylan Guenther** (9) for the team lead.
- Hayton matched his career-long goal streak twice this season (10/8-10/12: 3g, 2a in 3 GP; 1/20-1/24: 4g, 2a) and needed only five contests (10/8-10/16: 4g, 2a) to surpass his 33-game goal total from 2023-24.
- Hayton was also one of only four Utah skaters with multiple multi-goal performances (2), and he scored his first career NHL hat trick (3g), as well as the first hat trick in Utah Hockey Club history, at LAK (2/22). He lit the lamp twice on the power play in a single game for the first time in his NHL career, before ultimately factoring on seven of the team's eight goals on the man-advantage from 2/22-3/10 (4g, 3a).
- Hayton's third-period goal vs. DAL (12/23) also marked his 100th career NHL point, as he became the 15th player from the 2018 NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

THE GR8 PACE

- **Nick Schmaltz** registered 62 points (20g, 43a) in 82 games this season, setting new career highs in assists, points, power-play assists (16), power-play points (25), shots on goal (186), blocked shots (45) and faceoff win percentage (49.2%).
- Schmaltz reached the 40-assist plateau for the first time in his NHL career and eclipsed 20 goals for the fourth straight season (2021-25) and fifth time in his career (also 2017-18 with CHI).
- He led all Utah skaters with 12 multi-assist games, and his 14 multi-point outings tied **Dylan Guenther** for the third-most on the team, behind **Clayton Keller** (21) and **Logan Cooley** (15).
- Schmaltz also finished second on the team in assists and takeaways, third in points, power-play goals and power-play points, fourth in power-play assists and tied for fourth in goals and game-winning goals (3). His 18:35 of ice time per game ranked second among all Utah forwards.
- He posted a franchise-record, eight-game point streak from 1/10-1/24 (4g, 6a), just before recording an assist vs. PIT (1/29) which marked the 400th point of his NHL career. Schmaltz became the seventh Wisconsin native in league history and the ninth player from the 2014 NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

- Schmaltz registered two three-point games (both 1g, 2a) in 2024-25, in wins over MIN (2/27) and TBL (3/22) at Delta Center. His performance against the Lightning also included the second of his three game-winning goals this season.
- In addition to his three game-winning goals, he scored the shootout game-deciding goal in Utah's lone shootout win at WSH (2/9), which also stood as the first shootout goal in franchise history.

MAKING THEM PAY

- Utah went 57-for-236 (24.2%) on the power play this season, ranking 10th in the NHL in power-play percentage.
- Utah also converted on 28.2% of its man-advantage opportunities on the road (31-for-110), tied with FLA (29-for-103) for the third-highest road power-play percentage of any team in 2024-25.
- **Clayton Keller** tallied a team- and career-high 37 power-play points (10g, 27a), finishing tied for third in the NHL in power-play points and tied for seventh in power-play assists.
- He also registered 32 of those points over his final 55 games of the season (12/8-4/15: 9g, 23a), tying Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 7g, 25a) for the league lead in power-play scoring over that stretch.
- **Dylan Guenther** scored a team- and career-high 12 goals on the man-advantage, and seven of those came on the road, tied for the ninth-most of any NHL skater.
- Utah converted on the power play in seven consecutive games from 12/8-12/22 (9-for-25, 36.0%) and were one of only six teams to accomplish that feat in 2024-25 (also DET/VGK/PIT: 8 GP, BUF/WPG: 7 GP).
- The team also converted 12 times on the man-advantage over its final seven contests this season (4/3-4/15: 12-for-26, 46.2%) and scored a season-high four power-play goals in a 5-3 win at DAL (4/12), with tallies from **Barrett Hayton**, **Sean Durzi**, **Josh Doan** and **Nick Schmaltz**. Utah was one of just three teams to have four different players convert on the man-advantage in a single game this season (also OTT, 10/14 vs. LAK; FLA, 12/5 at PHI).
